Doctoral students can pursue a kinesiology minor in these same emphasis areas, with the addition of the sport management emphasis.

Program Requirements

Use of 4xxx courses toward program requirements is permitted under certain conditions with adviser approval.

Courses should be chosen in consultation with the student's major adviser and the School of Kinesiology's director of graduate studies.
